ANA World's Fair of Money Donald E. Stephens Convention Center Chicago, IL August 5–10, 2024

Monday, I arrived in Chicago late (American Airlines). Tuesday, Katie Williams got there about noon and we set up the FUN table. We had lanyards, pins, coasters, FUN Topics, FUN medallions, show apps and candy at our table. The weather was fine with highs in the low 80's and mornings in the upper 60's. There was a hotel shuttle to and from the airport, 15 minutes away. The show had 475 dealer booths. Several world mints were there and eight museum exhibits. The exhibit area had 285 cases and about 18 classes of exhibits. There were 38 exhibit judges. I judged U.S. Paper Money. The three of us agreed on 1st, 2nd, 3rd place right away. Best of show was an ancient exhibit.

Sodas were \$6, hot dogs & hamburgers were \$10. The hotel room for five nights was \$1548. Buffet breakfast was \$27.

There were 20 educational talks, 29 club meetings and events, 20 club tables and 16 mints, including the U.S. Mint. They had Ernie's Treasure Treehouse and Treasure Trivia for the kids. All of the grading services were there, and I took the NGC Trivia Grading Contest, 15 questions and five coins to grade.

I was able to purchase nine Kentucky notes I didn't have. I also purchased three Don C Kelly "National Bank Note" books (Sixth Edition) at \$75 each.

About four blocks from the hotel was the "Commons", which is a large grassy area with restaurants all around it. We ate at a sea food place and a beer garden.

Friday, we had the ANA District Representative meeting. 31 attended. Ideas were passed around and we all received a luncheon and the ANA convention medal.

I flew out Saturday at noon, two hours late (American Airlines). I got home at 5PM.

Denny's Minutia's Coins The Most Comprehensive Book on U.S. Coins Has Been Revised by Denny Thostenson

Now that I have your attention, or at least a few of you people that acquire books on coins, please allow me to continue.

The book entitled <u>A Guide Book of United</u> <u>States Coins</u> (2025, 78th edition) of the Red Book is now available.

It is the opinion of this author that the "Red Book" is one of the most comprehensive books ever written on the numismatic hobby. I have written an article on the Red Book in this column in the past.

It started out in 1946 as primarily a price guide for U.S. coins. It has been updated every year since then. The first edition of the Red Book had 254 pages from cover to cover. The 2025 edition has 472 pages.

Today's Red Book provides information on: mintages of U.S. coins from colonial issue coinage, all coinage issued for circulation through commemorative issues, proof and mint set coins, gold type coins, precious metal bullion coins, private and territorial gold coins. At the beginning of each series, current grading standards are included.

Also included is a section close to my collecting interests...mint errors. They cover descriptions and photos of mint errors and general pricing guidelines.

There is a section dedicated to those who collect vintage *Red Books* along with the history of the *Red Book* and the issue price of the book in the year it was published and current valuation.

The current edition contains all of the above information and MORE!

I believe that the current price for the hard bound issue is around \$25.00, and \$23.00 for the spiral bound issue. Longtime Palm Beach member, Sandy Pearl, sells coin related supplies at our shows.

Sandy has worked out a program with President Tony Swicer where by (dues paying members) can purchase the 2025 issue of the *Red Book* for, *GASP*! \$10.50 (while supplies last).
