Presidents Message

Wednesday, September 26th was Estate Auction #33-5. 129 out of 133 lots sold for \$6410. The club made \$320 but more importantly, several club members bought many proof sets & mint sets at half of Greysheet bid. What bargains!!!

Wednesday, October 10th was our Slab Auction #5. There were 124 lots of high quality collector coins. We sold 96 of 124 lots (77.4%) for \$22,504. The club made \$2250. This was our most successful slab auction to date. Wednesday, October 24th, **Richard Spencer** gave us a program on "A Complete Proof Franklin Half Set in "PCGS Rattler" Holders'.

Wednesday, November 14th is Estate Auction #36, 111 lots of collector coins starting at very reasonable prices. There are both US & World coins in this auction, plus some supplies and World Coin Books. This night is also Nomination of Officers & Board for 2019. The election is November 28th and members can put their lots up for auction on that night.

Wednesday, December 12th is our annual Awards Night, Pot Luck Dinner, and White Elephant Sale, starting at 6PM. Everyone is asked to bring a covered dish and a White Elephant donation. The club will provide the meat and drinks. This is the only meeting in December. The coin show is December 23rd.

December 31st is the deadline for our club essay contest. In 500 words or less, tell us why you would like to go to the *ANA Summer Seminar* in Colorado Springs in 2019. 

Ten Reasons to go to the ANA Summer Seminar

- 1. The first reason is, you will receive the best education money can buy! If you're interested in numismatics, taught by the most knowledgeable people in their respected fields, then this is the place to be.
- 2. It's free! The magic word is free. That's right, all you have to do is write a five hundred word essay or less and submit it to the Palm Beach Coin Club, F.U.N., or the ANA, and with searching, many other generous organizations will get you to Summer Seminar.
- 3. You will receive airfare, three squares, and a dorm room. When you wake up you will have a wonderful view of Pikes Peak, which is snow covered most summers, at over 14,000 feet.
- 4. Side trips at your expense to the summit of Pikes Peak, golf, the Denver Mint, or the Moonlight Mint, or whatever the ANA has planned for the new year.
- 5. The *Summer Seminar* has two sessions. Between the two sessions there is a very well

- attended coin show. The ANA provides a shuttle bus every hour to the venue and back.
- 6. The Money Museum and the ANA Lending Library offer you access to the biggest and best numismatic library anywhere. The Money Museum has many killer exhibits that change often. On permanent display you have the Brasher Doubloon, the 1913 Liberty Nickel, and the 1804 Dollar, not to mention a working minimint where you can mint your own coins. Over the course of your stay, the library sells its overflow of numismatic literature on a descending price scale. For example, first day full price, second day fifty percent off, and the third day seventy five percent off. The last day \$5.00 per box. Wow! From Lesher Dollars to some of the most outrageous Pattern Gold, the Money Museum is a vacation destination. For anyone, whether you're a numismatist or yet to be one, touring the museum is wonderful.
- 7. The Summer Seminar is held at Colorado College. The campus is beautiful with old and new architecture, short walks between classes, dorms, and cafeteria. In the evening, people congregate at the Lunar Lounge and swap stories, tell jokes, sing songs and imbibe with whatever you might want to drink.
- 8. There is a brisk trade with the Young Numismatists. You might want to buy, sell, trade, or give away your coins. I always bring coins to give away to the YN's, just to see the surprised looks on their faces.
- 9. It's always fun to go to Downtown Colorado Springs after class. It's a short Uber or Yellow taxi ride. Some great restaurants, pinball for the eyes, and around the corner on Pike Street next to the Pike Theatre, the best ice cream west of the Mississippi.
- 10. You'll be able to hang out with ME, a ninth year returning student who can't get enough of this place. Every year I feel I come back a better numismatist, a better club member, and a better person.
