

Denny's Minutia's Coins Book Grading (New & Used) by Denny Thostenson

In my many years of collecting coins, I have had the pleasure of meeting many, many knowledgeable people. Almost every one of these people derived pleasure from sharing their knowledge with others.

Numismatics is a very cerebral hobby. The more you know, the more you learn that there is so much that you don't know. Perhaps the best way to learn about our multifaceted hobby is to acquire books.

I've encouraged fellow collectors to obtain what I genuinely feel is the most informative books on coins... it' titled <u>A Guide Book of</u> <u>United States Coins</u> or in the hobby, we refer to it as the <u>Red Book</u>. It's been published almost every year since the first edition in 1947. The 2025 <u>Red Book</u> is the 78th edition. You can own your own copy every year for under \$30 and they can be purchased at every coin show you attend.

What I've found in my years of collecting is that every single knowledgeable person I meet, has an impressive library of books on many topics. I would be hard pressed to name a series that doesn't have a book written on it.

One way of building a library of coin books is to purchase used books. Your coin club may offer used books in their auctions.

Books are graded much like coins are graded. The better shape a book is in, the more it can sell for.

These are the most common grades used in grading books:

AS NEW- This book is in the same immaculate condition as when it was published.

FINE- A fine book approaches the condition as New, but without being crisp. The book may have been opened and read, there are no defects.

VERY GOOD- Describes a book that shows SMALL signs of wear, BUT NO TEARS on the pages or binding.

GOOD- A book graded Good describes the average used worn that has all of the pages present. Defects should be acknowledged.

FAIR- Describes a book that has complete pages but may lack endpapers. Binding or jacket may be also worn. Again, defects should be noted.

There are many more grades but for the purpose of our topic, these are the most prevalent.

I have been collecting early Red Books for decades. It's an interesting challenge but an aspect that does not break the bank when you find an edition you need.

It's also fun to collect previous editions of speciality books (ie. Large Cent varieties, Bust Half Dollar varieties or Silver Dollar varieties (VAM'S). For many years, I have been going online to look for rare books. I prefer Abe Used Books or Amazon books.

Many times, when I do find the book I'm searching for, there are several vendors to choose from with competitive prices and grades.

There has been an old adage that's been around our hobby for longer than I have been a collector, that rings true.

"BUY THE BOOK BEFORE THE COIN".
