Denny's Minutia Coins A Major Oops!

One of the things that keep older, more experienced coin collectors active in the hobby is the fact that you never know when a visually delightful specimen will come into your line of vision that will catch your attention. I'm talking about COINS guys! Come on man.

I enjoy going on line and looking through coins on eBay. You can find almost anything that you might collect there. Another reason perusing eBay, you can get a general idea of realistic pricing of your specialty, where in many instances, with the Gray Sheet only coming out one a month, by the time you get it, it's already obsolete.

A couple of weeks ago, I was just cruising eBay and came across some interesting mint errors. One of my favorite areas of collecting. Listed in this dealer's ad was a 1985-P Kennedy half dollar described as "an interesting error". To me, that means the seller couldn't place this error into the most commonly seen errors.

The photo clearly showed a line running from 5 o'clock to 8 o'clock that ran parallel to the rim until it just blended into the rim, on both ends.

Initially, I thought it's just a sizable die crack. Die cracks are very common on U.S. coins as the mint uses the dies until there is what would be considered, little life left in the die. I mean, dies are very hard pieces of metal that must withstand tens of thousands of strikes on hard metal blanks,

to produce a coin. The cost of a die, in the past has been considerable.



But back to this Kennedy half dollar, the field of the coin appeared to be on two different levels in the area of the die crack. Now I'm intrigued. The dealer was only asking a little over \$10 plus postage, so I risked my lunch money for the next week and bought the coin.



What I received really intrigued me. I turned the coin over and inspected the reverse, the obverse AND the third side of the coin, the rim. I examined the coin under my 16X hand held lens and then under a microscope. The coin surface, meaning the field, was on two slightly different levels. By this time, my heart beat rate was increasing to dangerous levels. (Yeah, I know, most of you are thinking, this goofball needs to "get a life").



In conclusion, it is my belief that the obverse die had formed a die crack and under continued usage, the die broke. The retaining collar kept the two pieces together long enough for the press to continue striking cons, for a very short time. This is what guys that really know what's going on as a "terminal die state". The life of the usable die had ended.

It is rare that an error of this magnitude gets this far, but they are known to happen.
