Denny's Minutia Coins 1964 Kennedy Half Dollar -The Accented Hair Variety-

On a dark November 22nd, 1963, President Kennedy was riding in a motorcade through Dallas Texas, in an open convertible. As they passed the now famous Texas School Book depository, a shot rang out.

President Kennedy had been shot. He was pronounced dead a short time later at the hospital.

I believe that every American who was alive on that day will always remember where they were and who told them that our country had lost one of the most popular Presidents to serve our country.

Almost immediately, plans were put in motion to honor John Kennedy with a silver coin. Jacqueline Kennedy was invited to give input into the commemorative coin. She was opposed to replacing George Washington with the image of her late husband, so the Franklin half dollar was chosen to be replaced.


The final designs were viewed by Jacueline Kennedy and the late President's brother Robert in mid December 1963. At that time, both agreed that the hair was "overworked". Changes were made immediately on the Proof dies.

Genuine Accented Hair specimens are only known, to this author, on Proof issues.

The changes are identifiable in the central area of the hair, just below the part.



The only fairly easy marker on the accented hair variety is on the obverse. In the word "LIBERTY" the "I" has the left serif or foot is broken off. (You need to get out your magnifying glass to see this...or Ron Plask will loan you his portable electron microscope.)



I frequently issue cautionary advice. This is one of those times. It is extremely difficult to differentiate between the accented hair and the reworked coin.

This has become a very popular variety for collectors. Do not pay a huge premium for this variety and do not buy a coin that is not slabbed by a reputable slabbing company (ANACS, ICG, NGC or PCGS).

This variety is very common and yet is promoted heavily.
